Amending the

Building Code

That section 1.107 (a) of Ordinance number 184 be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

1.107 (a) Before any permits are issued, the applicant therefor shall pay to the City Treasurer the fee for same in accordance with the following schedule:

Heating installations in existing buildings \$ 5.00

Oil burning installation, including tanks of not over 1000 gallons capacity 5.00
Oil burner installation, burner only 2.00

Moving buildings over public right-of-way 25.00 Moving buildings over private property Moving bundings only for alterations only.

NOTE: The fee for moving buildings, which are not over 12 feet wide and do not contain over 2500 cubic feet, shall be \$5,00.

The deposit required under section 1.107 (e) shall be \$100.00 in such cases.

Renewal of temporary permit _____ 1.00

The minimum building permit fee shall be_\$1.00 This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon ublication after the passage thereof.
