The amount of light used is eloquent testimony to the need of plenty of light for a critical seeing task such as this. Your vanity table, too, requires a definite amount of light—just as there is a definite amount needed for reading, writing, sewing and other household tasks. You can apply four simple rules to your household lighting that will assure good general quality of illumination throughout the house: (1) Use SHADES on all lamp bulbs to prevent GLARE. (2) Use shades with light-colored linings to get the most light. Wide shades, open at the top, are best. (3) Use correct-size lamp bulbs—"WATTS". In table and floor lamps with 3 sockets, use 40 watts in each socket; two sockets, 60 watts; one socket, 100 watts. (4) Have at least one-half as much light in the rest of the room as you have on your book, newspaper, sewing, etc.
