# We are all BLIND in the dark!

EYES need light. You can't see anything with-out light. And there is a proper amount of light for every seeing task. Of course, you could read by the light of an open fireplace. But it strains vision and does much more damage than our eyes tell us. The few simple rules which follow form a good guide to adequate home lighting. In the table or floor lamp next to your easy chair, you should have correct size lamp bulbs —"WATTS." If it is a three-socket lamp, there — WALLS. If it is a three-socket lamp, there should be 40 watts in each socket; if a one-socket lamp, 60 watts in each socket; if a one-socket lamp, 100 watts. 4ll lamps in your house should have SHADES to prevent GLARE. Whenever possible, use shades with light col-ored linings to get the most light, (Wide shades, open at the top, are best.) Finally, have at least one-tenth as upon light in the house of the one-tenth as much light in the rest of the room as you have on your book, newspaper, sewing, etc.
