club. East should first discard his seven diamonds, to show what he wants partner to lead, then he should let go his lowest heart, to ask partner not to lead that suit. On the third club of clubs, the dummy may let go his lowest diamond and East probably will let go his lowest heart. He holds only four diamonds and four spades for the moment. If West leads his last club, however, the dealer will make 2-odd, as his only other losing trick will be to the Ace of hearts. West should not lead a fourth round of clubs, that will establish a winner of the suit in South's hand, allowing him to win the following three tricks. The spade trick is two heart tricks, two diamond tricks and one club trick. In case of a heart lead, the dealer will lose before leading the diamonds, for which his partner has called it a time when he can take only 1-N Trump can be made.
