Jurist Commends Spank For Restraining Child

WRITES Judge Ross S. Sweet of Lake County, Ohio: "Dear Dr. Myers: I have been reading your so-called articles in the 'Dear Dr. Myers' column for some time, and with commendation you on your good advice to parents, especially your emphasis on the need of proper restraint of children in early childhood. From my experience as a judge I have been impressed with the obvious fact that most cases of crime had their beginnings in early childhood. The criminal and delinquent look back with regret for the rights of others and respect for constituted authority. I note that you believe the chief cause for this increased disregard for authority and the rights of others is the notion widely accepted by parents of the 'best' families that children should merely be reasoned with, and that parents should never resort to physical restraint. We observe that the children of these so-called 'best' families set the standard of conduct."

"The old-fashioned 'spank' has been taboo. I am glad you plead for its return in the early days. With its return, and more thoughtful use, cruel whipping of older children will decrease. On the other hand, the child restrained in his early years, even with the physical pain when necessary, will have established that respect for authority which is the foundation of good citizenship, and he will be less liable to need punishment of any kind as he grows older."

"Hope of Reducing Crime"—The hope of reducing crime is in proper education, so that parents may be led to restrain effectively the 'bad' reactions of their children and encourage the 'good' ones from earliest infancy. Unfortunately many of the child psychologists and parent educators are telling parents not to restrain their children. We suspect that many of our delinquents and criminals, and
