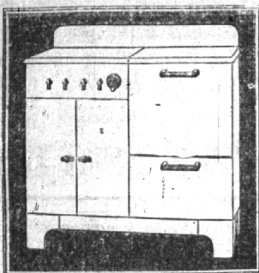

## WANTING PEACE AND GETTING WAR

Subject Of Sir Norman Angell's Lecture At Cass Theatre Friday

"Wanting Peace and Getting War" is the subject Sir Norman Angell will present at the Detroit Town Hall in the Cass Theatre, Friday morning, October 25th, at 11 o'clock.

A former member of the British Parliament, and winner of the Nobel Peace Prize, in 1933, Sir Norman who recently arrived from Europe, declares the present world systems of education are largely responsible for the depression, the system, having failed, among other things, to prepare the masses to understand the most elementary economic facts. For more than twenty years it has been the task of Sir Norman Angell, author of "The Great Illusion," "The Crisis in Democracy," "The Unseen Assassins," and inventor of the popular "Money Game" to try thru his books, his contributions to the American Press, magazine articles, and extensive lectures in England, France, Germany and also lectures in all the large colleges and universities in America, to bring to the adult mind the more fundamental facts of international life as they affect him and his nation's welfare. His book "The Story of Money" explains money in its social relation and shows what money has done to human society, the problems which it has solved and which it has created. The game which he invented, called "The Money Game" simplifies the teaching of economics particularly on the money side and is a combination of a book and cards thru which he has worked out an entirely new approach.

Sir Norman has rather a unique background. — English birth, French education, American experience, and business association for many years with men of letters and political leaders in England and in France. He was knighted by King George, in 1931, for his work for international peace, and this same year he resigned his seat in the British Parliament where he was a member of the Labor Party, to be in a better position to speak with authority on present English and world problems. His lectures have gained the name of "conversations with his audiences," and his books dealing with politics and economics, usually so abstruse subjects, have equalled the sales of fiction "best sellers."

## Better Lighting Will Aid Crowds At Auto Show

Many Added Features In  
Detroit Show Opening  
November 9

Every detail of the new 1936 cars to be shown at the coming Detroit Auto Show in Convention Hall is going to be easy to see this year even for those with poor eyesight.

The startling visibility will result from the fact that the lights at the big exhibition are going to be just 100 per cent more efficient than ever before, according to H. H. Stuart, show director.

The 35th annual show is scheduled to open November 9 and continue through November 16.

"We have worked out a lighting and decorative scheme for the coming show that will completely overshadow previous efforts in this direction," said Stuart.

The lighting arrangements especially will be unique and will consist of two separate types of illumination, one for the aisles and an entirely different set-up for the car and accessory displays.

"In this manner we will increase the efficiency of the light in the displays by at least 150 per cent, while maintaining a soft, blue glow in the aisles where the crowds move from one part of the exhibition to another."

**Same Decorative Motif**

All four sections of Convention Hall's three and a half acres will follow the same general decorative motif, Stuart added. The new high section of the building will have a huge vaulted ceiling arranged with saffron yellow and oriental-sand to form a step effect.

On each of these steps at 20-foot intervals there will be an oval shaped "eye" in two shades of blue and green. Behind these "eyes" will be concealed the lighting fixtures which serve to illuminate the aisles.

Ceilings of the car and accessory display spaces will be completely covered with canopies of saffron and oriental-sand shades, and the walls at the ends of these sections will be covered with modern cut-outs in blue, silver and orange. Half of the posts between the sections will be covered with a matching decoration, and half will be hidden from view by natural, blue palm leaves ranging from eight to 10 feet in length.

No effort is being spared to make the huge exhibit space the most brilliant and fitting background for glittering new car models that show visitors have ever seen.

Indicative of the increased interest in Diesel engines this year is the announcement that three organizations will sponsor displays of this type of power plant at the November show. The Robert Goddard Trust Co. will exhibit a Cummins Diesel engine similar in type to the one that made a remarkable economy run from coast to coast last summer. The other two Diesel exhibits will be staged by schools engaged in training mechanics to service the new motors. They are the Hemphill Diesel School and the New York Diesel Institute. Among other things it is planned to show a cutaway

Diesel aviation motor.

Fall Fashion Show

The entertainment program for the Convention Hall exhibit will include a Fashion Show of fall creations for women. Instead of featuring the models of one designer, as in the past, the Fashion Show this year will be conducted by the cooperation of 10 or more of the leading Detroit merchants. Specially selected models will be on view for the edification of feminine visitors.

An especially large attendance from all over Michigan is expected by the Auto Show management. Reports from out in the state indicate that interest in the forthcoming 1936 models is reaching a peak, and with the moving forward of the show dates November, it is believed that many thousands from neighboring towns and cities will drive in to get their first view of all the new cars at one time.

An added inducement for out of towners to visit the 35th Detroit Auto Show is the fact that leading passenger lines for central, southeastern, western, southwestern and Canadian areas will offer special railroad rates on round trip transportation. The rates call for reduced fare of one and one-half times the regular fare and have been granted for the Detroit Auto Show starting on November 6-7 and thence for the return to November 16-19.
