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ENROLLMENT EXCEEDS 2600

Schools Anticipate Further Registrations: Total 74 Ahead Of 1934

Birmingham High School enrollment figures are maintaining a pace slightly in advance of last year's comparable totals, superintendent of schools, Charles W. Crandell, said Wednesday afternoon.

One year ago the total school registration at the end of the second day was 2554 compared to Tuesday's figure this week of 2628, an increase of 74 students in the entire system. Mr. Crandell expects at least 100 more students to bring the enrollment above last year's average of 2648.

Two facts, Mr. Crandell believes, have tended to slow registration this year. One is the earlier opening of school, and the other the infantile paralysis scare which is responsible for many

If you see any one of Birmingham's 250 Boy Scouts dumping various assorted bulbs from their camp on the edge of the city, be duly alarmed for the boys merely need a little rebuilding done on the camp.

DETROIT MAN DRAWS 2-MONTH JAIL TERM

After he had apparently failed to do anything toward the settlement of damages caused when he was in an accident a week ago, Harry J. Rivard, 27 years old, of 2709 Medbury Grand avenue, Detroit, was sentenced by Justice H. A. O'Dell of Bloomfield Hills Tuesday to spend 60 days in jail.

Rivard's car crashed into a truck driven by Fisher avenue, Detroit, damaging the truck and causing slight injury to Fisher. Rivard was arrested on a reckless driving count but released to settle damages. He did not appear and drew the jail term. No alternative was offered.

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Bonds In Eight Series

The bonds would be issued in eight series, A, B, C, D, E, F, G, and H. Series A will total \$401,875; B, \$229,340; C, \$32,000; D, \$135,700; E, \$55,000; F, \$115,000; G, \$125,000; and H, \$38,592.94. The issues total \$1,291,507.94, which is the city's total indebtedness, minus the certificates of indebtedness.
