

**Services On Palm Sunday And Good Friday Announced**

Palm Sunday service at Christ Church, Cranbrook, on April 5th at 11 a. m., is called the Festival of Palm. It is commemorated by a procession of colorfully robed choir and just as colorfully garbed children carrying palm leaves which they wave on high during the singing of the hosanna. One of the features of this service is the reading of the Palm Sunday story from the balcony in the narthex of the church as the congregation faces westward. After this the procession moves to the chancel where the "Hosanna qui venisti" (Blessed is he who cometh) is sung by the choir. The sermon will be preached by the Rev. W. Hamilton Aulenbach. Good Friday Three Hour Service will be held in the church from 12 noon until 3 p. m. on the Friday before Easter, April 10th. It consists of the usual meditations on the last seven words by the Rev. W. Hamilton Aulenbach plus a series of light organ meditations by William Hill Mearns in addition to the usual hymns and prayers. The service is presided and followed by the tolling of the bells in the carillon tower.

**Problem Hand**  
I know it's a trivial analysis—a problem hand to tickle the writer. The hand is given below with a recitation of how to play it correctly. Since I got by this one rather easily, I probably am a m. l. let's have some more practice. If you've got a hand that can't be solved send it to the Bridge Editor. (Note: If I can't solve it either, I won't say anything about it.)

Here is the hand. South is Declarer at Seven Hearts and West opens the Club King. North-South must take every trick against any defense.

The bidding wasn't given but I imagine it would go something like this, assuming that East-West always passes:

South 2 North 2  
1 4 2 3  
2 4 4NT 3W  
4W 4NT 3W  
5NT 3W

The secret to making the seven Heart contract lies in discarding the AK of Diamonds in South's hand. To do this successfully, South must win the opening lead of the Club King with his Ace, throwing away one of Dummy's Diamonds. South then leads a low Heart to the board, next playing the Spade Ace on which he discards the King of Diamonds. The low Spade is trumped by South and another Heart is led to Dummy. The last Spade is left from North's hand and ruffed by South. The declarer then plays his last Heart, Dummy winning with the King. On the lead of the Heart Ace by Dummy South discards his Ace of Diamonds. This play establishes the Diamond suit. Dummy for the balance of the tricks.

If you think seven Hearts can be made any other way, try it.
