NEW TYPE HOMES NOW BEING BUILT

Three Complete Electric, Air Conditioned Houses Started

Following the modern trend in home building, the Judson Bradway Company, in a few weeks, will offer to Birmingham, for the first time, three completely equipped electric and air conditioned Kelvinator homes. These three homes are now under construction on Mohagan street near Adams road and when finished will be the latest in modern architectural structure, both in exterior design and interior planning.

The new homes are to be completely equipped with rear around air conditioning systems, recently developed by Kelvinator. In winter they circulate properly filtered heat and humidified air through the entire house while during the hot summer months the healthful and humidified air is drawn out of the house and replaced by cool, fresh air from the outdoors. In addition, the homes are equipped with water heater, water softener, and incinerator. All three are six room houses with attractive floor plans designed to meet changing scientific comfort requirements.

One of the most interesting features of the air conditioning system is the fact that the temperature of the house is cooler in summer when all the windows and doors are closed, demonstrating the truth in predictions by authorities in modern house designing that in a few years the "windowless house" will be common.

COUNTY 4-H CLUB SHOW NEXT WEEK

Three-Day Exposition Will Feature Paganon Youth's Work

Next week 4-H club boys and girls of Oakland County will hold their largest single event of the year when they participate in the county 4-H club exposition at Pontiac on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, Aug. 18, 19 and 20.

Approximately 200 boys and girls from all sections of the county will enter their livestock, earning, clothing and other 4-H work in the exhibit. Cash premiums totalling \$800 will be divided and selections of the most important bearing on participation in State contests will be made.

The Oakland County Road Commission has loaned its new garage building and surrounding grounds in Telegraph road, near Orchard Lake road, for the event.

A highlight of the fair will be a pageant to be presented on Wednesday evening under the direction of Prof. C. E. Nisick, Michigan State College, with about 200 boys and girls. The theme of this pageant will be the development and progress of 4-H work and it will be presented with appropriate costumes and scenery for the exposition which will play for the occasion will furnish music for the pageant. A parade of floats entered by the various clubs also will take that night.

The exposition is entirely an educational event and admission will be free.

In addition to the exhibits of the 4-H boys and girls, educational exhibits of both agricultural and scientific nature have been scheduled.
