Pickles Add Spice To Summer Menus

The housekeeper should take advantage of the many vegetables that the summer brings us by pickling the surplus. Pickles are an aid to digestion, in addition to which they serve as a refreshing tonic. These recipes are not difficult to make, try them.

Easy to Make Pickles
Cucumbers,
1 cup sugar,
1 cup salt,
1 cup dry mustard,
Vinegar.
Wash cucumbers with a damp cloth, but do not wash. Pack cucumbers in a 2 gallon jar to within 3 inches of the top. On top of the pickles put the sugar, salt and dry mustard, made into a paste, with vinegar. Fill the jar with vinegar and put a weight on top. They will be ready to use in about two weeks. These sour pickles can be used to make sweet or other fancy pickles or relishes.

Pepper Hash
2 dozen red bell peppers,
1 quart vinegar,
3 cups sugar,
6 onions,
1 teaspoon salt.
Remove the white fibre and the seed from the peppers. Peel the onions. Chop both meats, pour boiling water over them. Let stand 5 minutes, drain. Cook together with vinegar, sugar and salt, and peppers and onions. Boil up once. Put in sterilized jars and seal closely.

Cucumber Relish
1 quart cucumbers, sliced thin,
2 large onions,
1 large sweet pepper,
1 cup sugar,
1 teaspoon mustard seed,
1 teaspoon powdered herb salad.
Sprinkle sliced cucumbers with salt. Let stand 2 hours. Drain. Cut onions and pepper fine and add to the cucumbers and spices. Cover the whole with vinegar, being careful not to use too much. Heat thoroughly, but do not boil. Seal at once.
