Late Book Reviews and Literary Criticism

**A Booklist for Christmas Shoppers** If you are puzzling about what to buy for father, mother, brother or sister why not consider books. Wisely chosen books will be enjoyed by the entire family and the best months have produced many good ones. Here is a list to slip into your shopping bag when you start out.

"**One With the Wind**," Margaret Mitchell (Macmillan \$3.99) is a story of Civil War from the southern woman's point of view. A superb bestseller.

"**Drums Along the Mohawk**," Walter Edmonds (Little Brown \$2.50) is a novel of the American Revolution with the scene laid along the Mohawk Valley.

"**Eyeless in Gaza**," Aldous Huxley (Harcourt \$2.50) is a strange novel by a powerful writer. Better skip this one unless you are a family of sophisticated readers.

"**Green Margins**," E. P. O'Donnell (Houghton Mifflin \$2.50) is a regional novel with the Mississippi Delta for the setting.

"**Honey in the Horn**," H. L. Davis (Harcourt \$2.50) is a moving story of the hill-billies of Oregon of thirty years ago. It has won both the Harper and the Pulitzer prizes.

"**Education Before Verlan**," Arnold Zweig (Viking Price \$2.50). If you are not too tired of World War stories here is a good one.

"**I Am the Fox**," Winnifred Van-Kitten (Little Brown \$2.50) won the Atlantic Monthly \$10,000 prize for 1936. It is the story of Selma Temple, red-haired Iowa school teacher whose early experiences and impressions of life made her secretly afraid of it.

"**The Big Man**," John Dos Passos (Harcourt \$2.50) is an unofficial history of the United States from 1900 to 1920. It is New York, Hollywood, Detroit, aviation, politics and all the other sources through which the Big Man has been flexing during the past twenty years. It is written after a pattern that only John Dos Passos could get away with.

"**Whiteoak Harvest**," Mavis de la Roche (Little Brown \$2.50) brings the Johns chronicle up to date. This interesting story has lasted through six volumes up to now.

"**The Home Place**," Dorothy Thomas (Harper \$2.00) is the story of the struggles of a Nebraska family during the depression years.
