## Folk Dances Prove Popular With Saturday Club Girls

90 Enroll At Second Meeting To Learn Traditional English Steps

One of the most popular features of the Saturday Club this season is the class in old English folk dancing conducted by Mrs. Fred D. Farrar, president of the Birmingham Branch of the American Association of University Women, under whose auspices the Club has been organized and maintained.

At the second meeting this year held Saturday at the Community House, 80 girls between the ages of eight and ten years, enrolled in Mrs. Farrar's class to learn the quaint steps of an old dance called "Goddesses," and described as "a long ways dance for as many as will," in old English texts. Mrs. Farrar was assisted by her daughter, Diggins Farrar, and this week will have additional assistants, another daughter, Virginia Farrar and Marjorie Baldwin. Mrs. E. N. Allen is accompanist for the class.

Folk dancing has long been an avocation of Mrs. Farrar's, and in pursuit of the art, she spent a year in England. Mrs. Farrar, of Cecil Sharp, English musician noted as a collector of folk dances and some of which have become well known through the compositions of Percy Grainger.

From the folk dances she learned in England, Mrs. Farrar will select steps to be taught each week to her class at the Saturday Club. Later, parents and friends

of the group will be invited to an exhibition of folk dances.

Mrs. Farrar was formerly instructor for the English Folk Dancing Society of Chicago, and last summer taught English folk dances to girls at Camp Osoba-of-the-Dunes near Crystal Lake in Northern Michigan.

In the auditorium period, to which a portion of each Saturday afternoon is devoted, last week, Patrolman Grant Springstead of the local police department, addressed the children on safety.

The Saturday Club is sponsored by the A. A. U. W. to give Birmingham children an opportunity to learn various recreational arts under the supervision of experienced instructors. Children between the ages of eight and ten years are eligible to attend. The gatherings are held each week at the Community House.

As a health precaution, a medical examination is given by Dr. E. E. Hammonds. A large number of Birmingham women have volunteered their services to Mrs. Marjorie T. Casson, director, and instructors. Assisting also as guides, users and at the registration desk have been members of the Sigma Lambda, a local sorority.
