ALLEE SPEAKS TO ROTARIANS

Detroit Attorney Talks On Functioning Of Judiciary

William Coit Allee, prominent Detroit attorney, who resides here, delivered a highly informative address on the judiciary branches of government as guest speaker before the Rotary Club at their regular Monday luncheon held in the Community House. Edward H. Laird presided at the meeting and Harold Webster served as chairman of the program.

Charles W. Grandall, superintendent of local schools, was instrumental in securing Mr. Allee's services as a speaker. Following brief introductory remarks by Mr. Webster, Mr. Allee spoke to the assembly explaining in detail the functioning of the lower and higher courts. He expressed the opinion that all members of the judiciary should be pensioned following their term of six years in office. Mr. Allee explained that during that period of time contact is lost with the clients as a result it is difficult for a member of the judiciary to retrench in the legal profession.
