## Around The Circuit — AMERICAN LEAGUE —

The last ten days have been more or less eventful as regards individuals' feats. Al Simmons all but tied the major league record with ten pot outs. Joe DiMaggio did tie the record with two home runs in a single inning, driving in five runs. Chubby Dean of the Athletics equaled the record for pinch hitters by making two hits in a single inning. Irv Paul Andrews of the Browns, Hornsby's pitching ace in '35, hurled his first complete game of the season on June 21. Ralph Winegarner, leading pinch hitter of the American league in '35, was released outright to New Orleans as he no longer could hit in the pinches.

If Alvin Crowder, veteran American League pitcher, had deferred his voluntary retirement until July 15, he would have been the possessor of a life time pass as a result of completing ten years of service.

Jimmy Fox was the only American league batsman to make two home runs in a game three times this season up to June 28. Frank Crosetti of the Yankees and Zeb Bonura of the White Sox each accomplished that feat twice while Tony Lazzeri of the Yankees did it once and gathered three homers in another contest. The others to make two in a game at least once are Vosmik, Dickey, Owen, Radcliff, Bob Johnson, Gehrig, Ruffing, Tronzo, Simmons and Averill. Joe DiMaggio, the Yankees' sensational freethrow, has made three doubles in a game twice while Bottomley, Rolfe and Knickerbocker have turned the trick once.

The Detroit American league team has come out of their slump on June 20 when Tommy Bridges shutout New York. In the next four days, they came from behind to nose out New York 8 to 7 and Boston 8 to 7 and 7 to 6. Then, they took three easy ones from Philadelphia, a total of seven wins in eight games, the only defeat being when Boston downed them 7 to 6.

Two recent rookies, Larry Rosenthal of the White Sox and Roy Weatherly of the Yankees did away to a great start. In his first two games, Weatherly made two hits in a game and two triples, scoring three runs and driving in five. Also stealing three bases from Philadelphia. Rosenthal in seven games and one appearance as a pinch hitter gathered twelve hits, including two doubles and two home runs in 25 times at bat, scoring ten runs and driving in twelve. Both rookies felded brilliantly.

Lefty Grove has beaten Detroit four times this season, 2 to 0, 2 to 1, 6 to 3 and 7 to 6. Allowed five hits in each of his first two games, eleven in each of the next two.

The two victories registered over Cleveland by Lee Ross, Connie Mack's young right hander, have been by the same score, 8 to 6. In neither game, however, was Ross able to finish.

Two American league batsmen have made home runs in at least six parks this year. Jimmy Fox has hit four-sacks in each of the four Western fields and Boston and Philadelphia. None in New York or Washington. Joe DiMaggio has batted homers in every park except Cleveland and Washington. Bill Dickey, Lou Gehrig, Hal Trosky and Bob Johnson are the runners-up, each having hit home runs in five of the eight parks.

Outfielder Jess Hill of Washington still is a collegian as his hobby is fitting up his desk with college pennants and trophies as well as baseball souvenirs.

One of the big motion picture companies asked catcher Rick Ferrell of the Boston Red Sox if he would not put his pack of fox hounds on a train next month and take part in a picture they were going to take in Tennessee, a play on the order of "The Voice of Bugle Ann."

"I would like to," replied Rick. "But my contract with Boston calls for me to be catching in August, not starring with my dogs on the screen." Consequently, some other dogs will have to pinch for Rick's hounds.

Time was when the New York Yankees were fairly easy picking for southpaws but only two left handers have been able to beat Joe McCarthy's team this year. They are Bob Greve of Boston who beat New York 8 to 0 and 7 to 2 and Elton Huggitt of the Browns who has won two out of three from the Yanks. The latter have beaten Lefty O'Doul of the Red Sox three times, Lloyd Brown of the Indians three times, Earl Whittington of Washington, Lou Gehrig and Thornton Lee of Cleveland and Woody Upchurch of the Athletics each once.

Leslie Mann, former National league who conducted a baseball school at Miami, Fla. winter, extolled the ability of a youngster last March, that he had playing on

the team he took to Japan in December.

"That boy," said Mann, "is going to be one of the greatest hitters of all time. He is a 'Natural.'"

Geoffrey Heath is the name of the youngster in question. He had been signed by Willie Kamm acting for New Orleans, which is a Cleveland farm. The boy did not appear to be quite ready for the Southern league and was sent to Zanesville in the Mid-Atlantic circuit. The latest averages issued for that league show that Mann was not exaggerating much as in 212 times at bat, Heath has scored 60 runs, made 88 hits, including 24 doubles, 7 triples and 13 home runs, driving in 76 runs. It is logical to believe he will be with New Orleans, next year and with Cleveland in 1938.

Johnny Broaca of the New York Yankees, who pitched fourteen complete games in 1935, has gone the limit only twice this year, having been kayed nine times.

Vernon Kennedy of the Chicago White Sox seems to be doing the best of the American League sophomore pitchers, having won eight and lost but four. Johnny Whitehead, who broke even in 26 games in '35, has won six and lost seven after a miserable start.
