Robinson, Newly Appointed Supervisor, Announces Initial Schedule

Mr. W. Robinson, football and baseball coach of Baldwin High School and newly appointed supervisor of the Baldwin swimming pool, opened through a recreation fund raised under the auspices of the local Y. M. C. A., has announced details of the pool schedule for the opening week, beginning Tuesday (June 16).

Robinson stated all children using the pool must register on Monday to be eligible for swimming the following day. Registration will be from 9 to 12 in the morning and from 1 to 4 in the afternoon at the Barnum School. After the cards have been filled out they will serve for the duration of the summer, it was said.

Periods for boys and girls' life savers and water hose use will be held at the pool. Mr. Robinson said only cotton or silk suits may be worn in the pool, it was said.

GRADING REQUIRED BY ORDINANCE

Recently the Birmingham city commission on the subject of the "Milk Ordinance," amendment 133, providing that milk should be graded according to its classifications. The three groups include certified milk, which may be raw or pasteurized; and Grade B milk, pasteurized.

Grading of milk is done on the basis of sanitary conditions at the production point and on the condition of the milk when it is delivered to the consumer.
