cupes and put in refrigerator to chill. Combine flour, sugar, mustard, salt and cayenne and add to slightly beaten egg yolks. Add milk and butter. Cook over hot water about 3 minutes, then add vinegar slowly. Cook, stirring constantly, until slightly thick. Chill. When ready to serve combine cabbage, tomatoes and dressing.

**Fried Green Tomatoes**  
Slice green tomatoes 1/3-inch thick. Dip in seasoned corn meal

and saute in hot fat until brown on both sides.

**Tomato Filled With Egg Salad**  
Select round medium sized tomatoes; peel, then hollow deeply. Season inside with salt and pepper and turn upside down to drain. Hardcook the same number of eggs, chill and chop coarsely, adding to each egg 1 tablespoon of chopped ham, chicken or tongue, and 1 tablespoon of diced celery. Moisten well with a stiff mayonnaise or boiled dressing and

stuff the tomato, heaping up well in the center. Garnish each tomato with a sprig of water cress inserted in the salad container and chili well.

**Variety Salad**  
Arrange crisp lettuce around edge of rather large platter and fill in the center with heart leaves. On one side lay overlapping slices of tomatoes and on the other side slices of cucumber. Garnish center with curled celery and

watercress. Serve with French dressing to which crumbled Roquefort cheese has been added.

**Creamed Tomatoes and Cheese**  
3 large tomatoes  
4 tablespoons fat  
1 1/2 cups milk  
1 teaspoon salt  
Pepper  
6 tablespoons grated cheese  
3 hard boiled eggs  
6 slices buttered toast  
Parsley

Wash, stem and cut the tomatoes in halves crosswise. Dip in seasoned flour, then saute in the hot fat until golden brown on both sides. Arrange on the toast in the center of a platter. Add the flour to the fat left in the skillet, stir until smooth, then add the milk gradually and the salt, pepper and grated cheese. Cook gently, stirring until smooth. Add the eggs which have been sliced and when hot, pour over the toast and tomatoes. Garnish with parsley.

Place a layer of the browned eggplant on each bottom of a baking dish, cover with one of tomatoes. Continue adding alternate layers until the dish is nearly full. Top with buttered crumbs.
