## Dishes To Tempt Laggard Appetite

The normal appetite has a tendency to lag during the summer months. The chief worry for the housekeeper is to have meals that are appealing and nutritious. Cold drinks such as iced tea, any iced fruit juices and iced chocolate are most refreshing and beneficial. Use plenty of green vegetables and many gelatin dishes are ideal for the summer menu.

**Grape Punch**  
1 pint grape juice.  
1 cup sugar.  
1 quart water.  
Juice of 2 lemons.  
Juice of 1 orange.  
Heat water and sugar until the sugar is dissolved. Cool. Add to fruit juice and chill. Serve with ice and slices of lemon.

**Melon Ball Cocktail**  
Cut melon in half and remove seeds. Scoop out balls, using a French cutter or the 1/2 teaspoon in your measuring set for this purpose. Cover with grapefruit juice to which a few drops of lime juice has been added. Chill thoroughly. At serving time arrange in cocktail glasses and garnish with mint.

**Jellied Tuna Fish**  
1 package lemon gelatin.  
1 cup boiling water.  
2 tablespoons vinegar.  
1 teaspoon salt.  
1 cup tuna fish flakes.  
1 cup cooked peas.  
2 tablespoons pimiento, finely chopped.  
1/2 cup mayonnaise.

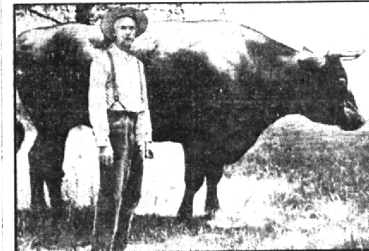
Dissolve gelatin in water, add vinegar and salt. When slightly thickened fold in remaining ingredients. Pour into mold. Chill and serve on lettuce, with additional mayonnaise.

**Jellied Chicken**  
1 1/2 cups chicken stock.  
1 cup diced celery.  
1 small onion.  
1/2 cup gelatin.  
2 tablespoons cold water.  
2 tablespoons salt.  
2 cups cooked chicken, cut up.  
1/2 cup chopped nut meats.  
Paprika.

**Jellied Ginger Pear Salad**  
Heat to the boiling point 8 halves of canned pears, 2 cups canned pear juice, 1 tablespoon chopped preserved ginger, and 2 tablespoons ginger syrup. Remove

Slice the cheese and serve on lettuce, alternating the cheese slices with slices of tomatoes. Garnish with whole peanuts and serve with French dressing.

**Orange Ice**  
2 cups water.  
1 cup orange juice.  
1 cup sugar.  
2 tablespoons lemon juice.  
Grated rind of 1 orange.  
Make a syrup of water and sugar. Boil ten minutes. Add fruit juices and grated rind. Cool and freeze.

**Lime Ice**  
1/2 cup lime juice.  
1/4 cup sugar.  
2 egg whites.  
Pinch of salt.  
Small quantity of food coloring. Cook sugar and water for 10 minutes. Add strained lime juice and cool. Add small amount of green food coloring. Chill and freeze. When nearly frozen pour into a bowl and whip. Add beaten egg whites to which a pinch of salt has been added. Freeze.

**Maple Bavarian Cream**  
1 cup maple syrup.  
1/2 package of gelatin.  
1 cup whipped nuts.  
1/2 cup cream, whipped.  
3 egg yolks.  
1/4 cup cold water.  
Boil syrup and pour gradually
