

UPTURN IN PONTIAC SALES NOTED WITH MILD WEATHER

A week of mild weather at the end of February started the wave of automobile buying that was predicted would follow the severe cold of the preceding month.

Figures given out by Pontiac Motor Co. indicate that almost as many cars were delivered during the nine days of February as in all of the rest of the month combined.

Total Pontiac retail deliveries in February were 8,515, of which 3,809 were delivered in the last nine days. This last period figure exceeds the same ten-day period of a year ago as well as the last 10-day period of January.

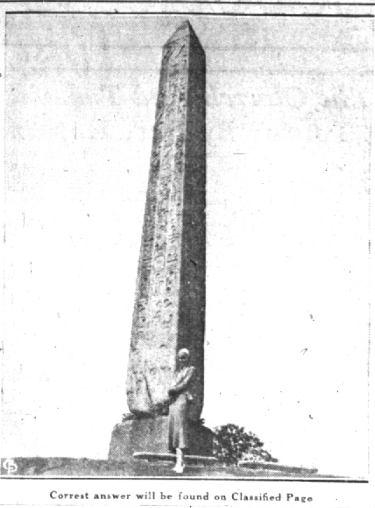

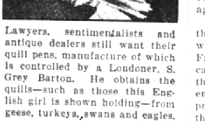

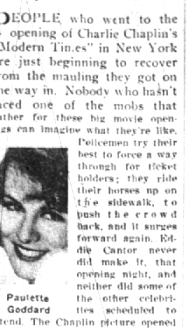
U. S. Senate Will Try Judge

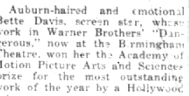
