BITS ON BRIDGE E. G. Whitney

There are only two bids that a defensive player can use to force his partner to respond after his opponents have opened the bidding. They are the double and the overcall in opponent's bid suit.

There is little to the play of the hand. South must lose the Spade Ace, the Club Ace and the Ace of Diamonds regardless of how he plays. The only opening lead which would defeat West's fourth bid, is a Diamond. The Club bid was a good sacrifice, therefore.

When you make a takeout double you tell your partner three things. First, that you have from three to three and one-half honor tricks in your hand as a minimum. Secondly, that your strength is a tribute to that you can stand any response he may make or asking that, you hold a hidden suit of your own to "rescue" yourself if partner bids your weaker suit.
