Explorer Burg Is Featured At Art Institute Sunday

Amos Burg, young explorer and adventurer, sailed in a tiny boat from South America to bring back the first complete motion picture record of this wild and picturesque region. He will show his motion pictures and give a public lecture on "Around Cape Horn in a 26-Foot Skiff" at the Detroit Institute of Arts at 3:30 Sunday afternoon, March 29.

The explorer shipped his skiff 7,000 miles south to Patagonia, there, with a single companion, he started for Cape Horn. He smashed his way through thirteen hurricanes. He photographed two of the world's wildest and most primitive tribes, the Alacaluf and the Yaghan. His motion pictures are a stirring combination of land and sea adventure.
