BALDWIN FIVE LOSES 27-24 AFTER RALLY

Brilliant Play in First Three Quarters Falls To Hold St. Mary's

St. Mary's high school gained the honor of winning the basketball championship Pontiac, a basketball team, but a fighting Birmingham basketball quintet made the Pontiac champions look like any other second-rate basketball team for three quarters Friday night, February 28, on the Baldwin court.

For three quarters they outplayed and outshot the Red and White favorites. For three quarters only. The St. Mary's team staged a furious drive and proved its right to the title "Champions" by coming from behind to score two baskets and win 27-24 in the final minutes of the game. Birmingham failed to closely follow the set rule of basketball when you're ahead in the last quarter. Had they retained possession of the ball and not attempted needless long shots, it is extremely probable that they would have won. St. Mary's scored only 14 points in the first three quarters, but they scored 13 points in the final minutes of the game.
