Over 3,000 extractions were performed and 8,063 fillings were inserted. 1,512 prophylactic treatments were given and 11,378 other dental operations accomplished.

Dr. W. C. Quinlan served the Northern district of the county and Dr. L. F. Richards the Southern section. The work was made possible by large donations from Senator James Couzens.

Oakland County Flood Fund Total Over \$6,500 Mark

Dr. Harold A. Furlong, chairman of the Oakland County chapter of the American Red Cross, recently announced that a total of \$6,510.53 has been contributed by the citizens of this county toward the flood relief fund. He said, "The officers of the Oakland County chapter of the American Red Cross wish to take this opportunity to express their appreciation received from these various groups. They realize that in many cases the people who gave were sacrificing real needs in their own homes."

Money for the relief of districts in Eastern United States, which suffered severely from floods, came in each day from March 20 through April 21. Amounts sent in all the way from seven cents, contributed by a Sunday School class of very small boys, up to \$100. Church, luncheon clubs, P. O. E., school women's club, young people's organizations, unions, made substantial contributions which helped to increase the amount to the final total. Birmingham and Bloomfield Hills contributed \$1234 toward this total, the funds being raised within one week.
