Recipes Borrowed From Other Lands

Not all of us can take trips to foreign countries, but we can easily acquire skill in preparing some of the dishes served in them. The following recipes are among those commonly served and are popular with Americans. The materials can readily be obtained.

Spaghetti Montparnasse (French)

1 package spaghetti
 1 cup tomato sauce
 Boiling salted water
 Thin slices Swiss cheese
 Cook spaghetti until just tender in boiling salted water. Drain thoroughly, and combine with tomato sauce which has been heated. Toss all together so that spaghetti is thoroughly blended with sauce. Turn into a generously buttered baking dish and cover surface with cheese. Bake in hot oven until golden brown and serve immediately.

Oyakodombori (Japanese)

Scramble eggs with small pieces of lettuce, chicken, Shogun to taste with soy sauce and sugar. Serve on hot rice.

Rutabaga Cakes (Swedish)

Cook rutabagas tender, drain, add half the quantity of freshly boiled potatoes, mash, season with salt, butter and black pepper. Form into cakes, dip in beaten egg and crumbs and fry a golden brown in butter.

Jatzeni Kneclly (Czech-Slovakian)

Cream 1/2 cup of butter and 1/2 cup of sugar. Grated 1/2 cup of lemon, a pinch of allspice and white pepper, salt to taste and mix thoroughly. Then add 2 pounds of ground calf's liver and enough bread crumbs to make a stiff batter. Stir thoroughly and let stand one-half hour. Then make into little dumplings and boil in salted water for one-half hour. Remove and cut each dumpling in half. Scramble with fresh cream and pour hot melted butter over them. Serve in clear soup.
