That stack our Welfare Cupboard Shelves Until someone needs 'em. Still others come to treat them For Thursday Lucy feeds 'em.

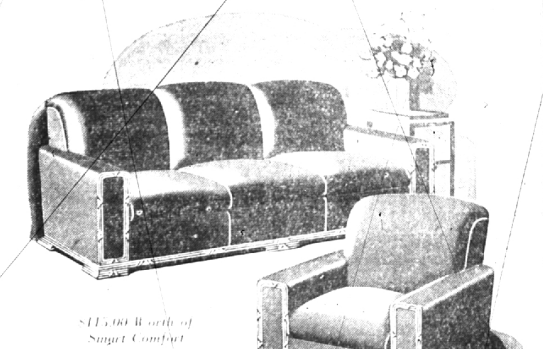

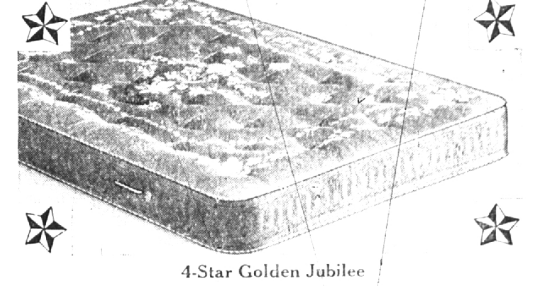
