City Manager James W. Parry, for the second time within 18 months, tendered his resignation to Birmingham's city commission at Monday night's meeting in City Hall and the council unanimously accepted it after Commissioner Wilmer E. Moody had made a motion to that effect and Commissioner Frank Beck had seconded it. Mr. Parry, in commenting on his impending departure from municipal service, stated that he has accepted a position as director of the in-service training of public employees with the Bureau of Government at the University of Michigan.

The resignation will become effective on November 30 and Mr. Parry expects to assume his new duties on December 1.
