**Reserve Power Enables Pontiac To Crack Maple Defense And Win, 13-0**

Outweighed ten pounds to the man, a fighting Baldwin gridiron went down to defeat, 13 to 0, Saturday afternoon at Pierce Field when the Pontiac high school Chiefs, rushing in reserves, swept aside the tiring Maroon regulars late in the fourth quarter to push across two touchdowns. For three quarters of the contest the Maple line and backs carried the fight to their opponents and only the lack of capable substitutes in the closing minutes of the fray caused their downfall.

A Class A team, the Pontiac squad failed to show any offense during the first half, playing on the defense most of that time. After the intermission, Birmingham elected to kick off after the Chiefs decided to defend the North goal with its wind to their backs. Comas, the visitors' quarterback, returned the boot to his 25 yard marker. On the second play of the game, Pontiac was penalized 15 yards for holding in the line and Kinney, who failed to substitute on of boots with Rocheau, the locals' safety man, punted to the Maroon 45 yard stripe.

Following an exchange of punts, Pontiac drew another 15 yard penalty for holding, forcing Kinney to kick from his goal line, the ball going out of bounds on the Pontiac 40 yard stripe. Howling at a nine yard pass to Mintling and Harrington ploughed center for first down on the Chiefs' 20 yard line. Here the threat ended when Birmingham drew a 15 yard penalty for holding.

Late in the first quarter, the Maroons were given a scare when Harrington, attempting to punt near his goal, had the kick blocked, Pontiac recovering on the 20 yard stripe. Three line backs gained only six yards and a pass went out of bounds. The locals promptly kicked out of danger at Clark taking possession of the punting. The quarter ended with Clark intercepting a Pontiac line and racing to the visitors' 45 yard line before being dropped.

The second quarter proved uneventful, the ball remaining with in the 30 yard lines most of the time as both teams resorted to time backs and punts. Four times in this period the Chiefs attempted to skirt the locals' left end and four times Clark, who played a brilliant defensive game, turned them back without gain. The only highlight of the quarter was a 15 yard dash off tackle by Captain Harrington. The Pontiac secondary line had dropped back anticipating a kick but Harrington grabbed the oval on his own 20 yard line, shook off two linemen and raced to his own 35 yard stripe before being downed.

A 15 yard pass late in the first half enabled the Chiefs to come within striking distance of the Maroon goal but two tries at tackle, an incomplete pass and a long end run failed to gain ground for the visitors and gain sounded ending the second quarter.

During that winning streak, Allen struck out ninety-six batters. He pitched three three-hit games, one four two and two seven hit games.

Allen, by the way, is one of the few American League starting pitchers to be credited with a victory although he did not pitch two innings. Johnny went only 1 1/3

**AROUND THE CIRCUIT AMERICAN LEAGUE**

If Joe Di Maggio could have batted against St. Louis pitchers all season, the Yankee's sensational young outfielder, probably would have broken all batting records. But, the schedule called for Joe to face the Browns' hurlers in only twenty-two games and this is what he did: gathered fifty-two hits and scored thirty-one runs in ninety-nine innings at bat, his hits including twelve doubles, three triples and ten home runs, his total base record being exactly 100. He batted safely in every game except one, Knott blanking him in three times at bat.

Up to Saturday, Sept. 13, Di Maggio batted 395 against Washington, making eighteen hits in forty-nine times at bat in eleven games. He played in nineteen games against Chicago for an average of 3.41, making thirty hits in eighty-eight times at bat. He went the entire twenty-two games against Detroit, batting 338 and collecting thirty-two safeties and scoring twenty-one runs in ninety-eight times up.

Boston, Cleveland and Philadelphia pitchers held the California Italian below the 200 mark. He batted 275 against Boston, making twenty-five hits and scoring seventeen runs in ninety times at bat in nineteen games. He hit out 242 against the Indian pitchers, making twenty-two hits in ninety-one times at bat in nineteen games. Up to date, however, Connie Mack's youthful pitchers have been the most successful against the Coast sensation as Di Maggio has hit but 216 in the sixteen games he has played against Philadelphia—sixteen hits in 74 times at bat.

Di Maggio has been held hitless in twenty-seven games, counting the game in which Jack Knott treated him to ephors. Lee Rose of the Athletics turned the trick three times. Len Rowe, Johnny Allen and Mel Harder each twice. Others blanking Joe once without assistance of a relief pitcher were Wes Ferrell, Walberg and Grov of Boston, Appleton and DeShong of Washington, Bridges of Detroit, Hildebrand of Cleveland and Lyons, Kennedy and Winehead of Chicago.

Sunny Jim Bottomley, first baseman of the St. Louis Browns, broke a major league record, Sept. 13 when he consummated his eighth unassisted double play of the season. The
