right shoulder. William arose and struggled up the stairs but toppled over in the kitchen. He was dead when Coroner Kimball and police arrived.  
Members of the Enners family claim that the gun discharged

while resting on a work bench and struck William as he sat on the last step of the basement stairs. They say George carried the mortally wounded youth to the kitchen where he died.  
Mr. and Mrs. Enners were not at home at the time of the fatal shooting, having gone to the bakery operated by Mr. Enners on South Adams Road. A verdict of accidental death was given by Coroner Kimball.

difficult to regiment under iron discipline, the speaker said.  
If human experience counts for anything, we must remember that dictatorship passes through a definite cycle, the former University of Michigan professor said. It begins with enthusiastic support which becomes static as the dictator appoints his hold his position through force and as a result revolution sets in.

Professor Frayer stated that Democracy was firmly entrenched in this country because the people favored the freedom of speech, the press, enterprise and working on a job that any man could do. If these things would result in instant uprisings, however, he pointed out that the rights of man are not so easily won. It is not so easy to win them and more important, it is not so easy to hold them without a struggle.

In concluding his talk the speaker said it might be best to keep in mind the words of the French statesman's remark to the effect that unless the Democratic leadership of this country is to discipline itself, it is to be discarded.

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
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
