Republicans Offer Progressive Planks

A Republican Administration for Oakland County

Nothing can be of more paramount importance in state government these days than the pursuit of a pay-as-you-go policy. Certainly Gov. Frank D. Fitzgerald did not invent the phrase, but it is not certain that here in Michigan he caught it up and applied it when he took up his duties as chief executive in 1935.

Such a policy was first and foremost at all times during the present Republican administration in this state, and it is the avowed intention of the governor and all other candidates on the state Republican ticket that the balanced budget in Michigan will be maintained.

It is, therefore, so wonderful that the Republican state convention assembled at Grand Rapids should make its number one plank one that pledged a continuation of the pay-as-you-go policy and the balanced budget.

The second plank, or tenet of the platform, has to do with civil service, a real civil service devoid of political abuses. The party leaders are firm in their belief that the state's departments and institutions should be taken out of politics and placed squarely upon a normal basis. This has long been the thought and open declaration of Governor Fitzgerald, and the newspapers of the state have heralded his stand on the question.

The schools of the state rank among the best, and far above most, throughout the country. It is one of the principles of the state Republican party that we should have sufficient school aid to assure every child a full school year. Likewise has the party placed itself on record as being in full accord with the restoration of teachers' salaries to a normal basis.

The Republican party of Michigan has honestly pledged itself to support and enact any legislation that will provide for an adequate system of unemployment insurance, and likewise it has declared itself in behalf of payment of compensation to workmen suffering occupational diseases.

The last, but by no means the least, of the planks accepted in the present Republican state platform has to do with appropriations to enlarge the state's hospital facilities. This matter is one of importance in Michigan and is a pledge that will be fulfilled by the return of the party to the handling of state affairs for the next two years.

Taken by and large, the principles thus set out as mileposts for direction in state government are ones which the Republican party has just cause to believe will afford it the united support of all persons in Michigan interested in safe and sound government.

While it is true that the major issue of the coming election is the return of a National Administration which will be sound and stable, American without a question of doubt and capable to give our country a business-like Administration, it is likewise important that your County Government be placed in the hands of men of proven ability and integrity who will be in accord with the policies of the National and State Administrations.

The Oakland County Republican candidates have been nominated because they have given the people of Oakland County a business-like administration, devoid of questionable acts and fearless in their efforts to render an impartial service to all the people of Oakland County.
