Miss Cooke Will Address Group On England As It Is Today

According to club tradition, "Officers' Day" will be observed by the Birmingham Women's Club at the opening meeting Tuesday, at the Community House at 2 p. m.

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International Relations Class To Begin Its 14th Consecutive Year

A program of particular interest will be presented by Miss Adeline Cooke, of Baldwin Public Library, who spent the summer in European countries, and witnessed events of historical significance. Miss Cooke was in London on the birthday of King Edward VIII, and attended the ceremony at Oxford University, at which Sir Anthony Eden was awarded an honorary degree. Miss Cooke's subject will be "England, 1936."

At the brief business session, reports will be presented by Mrs. John S. Black, president; Mrs. Mariel Jeffries Hurd, and Mrs. Treasa Way Merrill, of the recent convention of the Michigan State Federation of Women's Clubs at Manistee. At the business session, also, the preliminary committee appointed to consider plans for a safety campaign, will be presented to the club.

Members of the board of directors will act as hostesses for the tea following the meeting. Mrs. Edward H. Laird is in charge of arrangements for the tea. Presiding at the table will be Mrs. W. S. Toothaker and Mrs. Katherine Vahney Mills, who are club directors.

In the autumn of 1923, a group of Birmingham women met at the first Community House on the corner of West Maple avenue and Bates street, to study world events that were shaping history.

The group was sponsored by the local branch of the American Association of University Women, with Mrs. Charles J. Shain, author of international relations, as the leader.

Tuesday, at 10 a. m., in the Mary Griffith lounge of the present Community House, the class will meet to resume work in its 14th consecutive season, and will continue throughout the year. Particular attention will be directed toward the political parties of 1936 at the opening meeting. Mrs. Shain said, in respect to foreign policies, platforms on tariff and trade, and the promises they hold forth concerning world peace.

When the class was organized in 1923, it consisted of between 15 and 20 members. Among those who first attended, were Mrs. George R. Averill, Mrs. W. A. P. John, Mrs. E. W. Shattuck, Mrs. Fred D. Farrar, Mrs. Hope Ferguson Lewis, Mrs. W. S. Gilbreath, Jr., Mrs. Hugh H. Weman, Mrs. J. N. Hadjisky, and others. As time passed, attendance steadily increased.

During the past season, the average attendance was 40, and sometimes as high as 80 in the class. Because of the large number enrolled, the leader, Mrs. Shain, is assisted by two associate leaders, Mrs. W. A. P. John and Mrs. H. S. Burlingame, and Mrs. Frank L. Main is secretary.

The class is a voluntary service, and is open to any woman in Birmingham interested in attending, without fee. It is not altogether a study class, although a large number of those attending contribute by taking part in the research work and discussion. Others may assume the role of audience, if they prefer to listen rather than take a more active part.

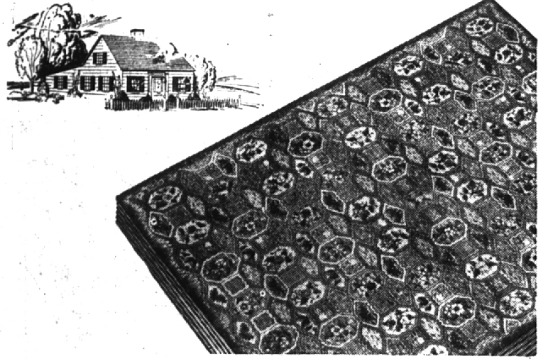
