Baldwin Gridders Unleash Aerial Attack to Win Friday, 18-13

Displaying marked aptitude in an overhead attack, Baldwin High School's gridiron eleven snapped their two-game losing streak Friday afternoon, putting over three touchdowns to defeat the strong Pershing High platoon from Detroit.

Couch Ernest Engel was pleased with the strong aerial game unleashed by the locals and he plans on developing this weapon for coming encounters this season.

Two of Birmingham's scores came as the result of long runs by Harrington and Carey following successful forward passes. Carey romped for 40 yards for his touchdown after pulling one of Howling's heaves out of the air, while Captain Harrington twisted 50 yards after catching Clark's pass.

The Maroon aerial attack which was responsible for Baldwin's only score against Wayne in the season's opener and which threw a bad scare into the Pontiac camp last week, was again in evidence in the Pontiac ten yard stripe late in the game on a "sleeper" pass from the quarterback to an intercepted returning factor in the team's remaining game. 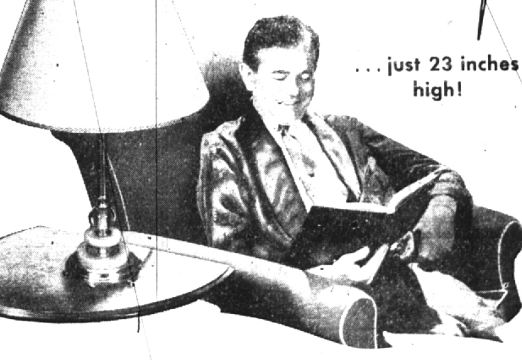
