New Two-Way Three Bid

Designed to handle extreme bidding situations, the new two-way three bid, as explained by "Contract Bridge Complete," authored by Ely Culbertson, serve a dual role as either name implies.

Such bids show either a hand powerful in the trump suit, in addition to a long, strong trump suit, contains up to four and one-half honor tricks.

Any opening suit bid of three in a minor or major, as explained by the head of a two-way three bid. The objects of the new bid are three-fold. First, they may trap the opponents by forcing them to overcall at a dangerous level; secondly, the bid often shows out strength in the trump suit, which may be a powerful hand and the bidding has reached the four level.

The requirement for the opening bid out three bid includes only a long, powerful trump suit and little or no defensive strength. But the hand must contain seven sure winners offensively and not more than four in the trump suit. The strength showing three bid also fits the partner that the opening bidder holds a strong trump suit and not more than one honor trick, being just short of a forcing two-bid.

If the original three bidder re-bids his suit after partner has taken out, it is always a sign-off and shows that the hand is the shut out type. Any other bid made by the opening bidder is indicative of strength.

Partner's responses to opening three bids will be discussed next week. Typical two-way three bids are shown below.
