Banding has filled many vacancies in the record of bird travels, and the present birds banding industry has been a most interesting discovery of these, one of the most arresting in the knowledge that some birds which fly thousands of miles across jungles, mountains and large bodies of water, return each year to build their nests in the same locality or in the same home or tree. Some birds use each previous year's nest as a foundation for the new one until as many as ten nests are found, one above the other.
