ACCIDENT TUESDAY CAUSED BY SMOKE

Occupants of Cars Suffer Severe Head, Body Injuries
Impaired vision caused by a smoke screen from a road side grass fire was the cause of a head-on collision of two cars early Tuesday afternoon in which three persons were severely injured. The accident, which occurred on Vaughn road near Lohrer, resulted in Charles L. Davidson, driver of the car, being rushed to St. Joseph's Mercy Hospital, Pontiac, with chest, leg and internal injuries.

Occupants of the second car involved in the crash were Dominic and Sam Vetraino, employees of the Cranbrook Foundation. The former suffered possible concussion of the brain, a broken nose and severe shock. Sam received welts and bruises and was taken, with his brother to the Cranbrook Infirmary.

Because a three-year-old child was standing on the front seat of his car talking to him, the vision of Eric Bohles, 131 1/2 Lincoln, was blocked and he was unable to see the car of Mrs. Stowe Baldwin, 483 Woodward, which was parked at the curb. The accident occurred when Bohles, driving north on Woodward, crashed into the parked car, causing considerable damage to both machines.

Lee Crowell, 1247 Bird, in not stopping for a stop street at the intersection of Oak and Fairfax, April 12, at 10:45 p. m., crashed the car driven by John B. Lick of 1291 Humphrey. Slight damage was done to both cars.

Four Detroit young people were taken to St. Joseph's Hospital late Saturday afternoon when the car in which they were riding overturned on Woodward avenue just south of Gharling Cross road. A machine driven by an unidentified woman forced them to the soft shoulder of the road causing the machine to overturn. The driver of the second car did not stop.

In the car were Evelyn Williams, 21; her sisters, Letha, 21, and Alberta, 18; and Jeanne Taylor, all of Detroit.
