WASHINGTON LETTER Court Fight Seems Due to End in Some Restriction on Judiciary BY SPECIAL CORRESPONDENT

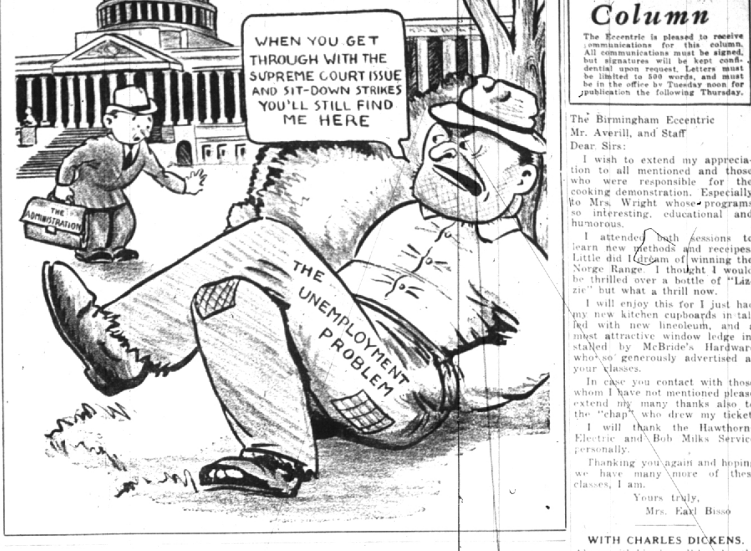
WASHINGTON—Witnesses appearing before the Senate Judiciary Committee in hearings on the proposed Roosevelt court plan and subsequently a decline in the power and prestige of the court are in fact the most likely result of a constitutional amendment

Those who favor Roosevelt's proposal admit that if it is adopted, we might be nearer a parliamentary form of government, but they deny that such a change would be in the country any closer to dictatorship.

According to some of the New Deal strategists, we may see the adoption of the Roosevelt court plan and subsequently a decline in the power and prestige of the court are in fact the most likely result of a constitutional amendment

IF that point were reached, Congress would be theoretically supreme in the field of government with the single exception of the veto power of the executive branch.
