Latest Library Additions
Written By Esteemed Authors

"The new books at the Baldwin Library include six outstanding works of fiction, just the thing for reading in this energy-sapping weather. All have been widely heralded and all are written by authors held in high esteem in the literary world. You probably have read advance notices of at least two on this list.

"Northern Summer," published by Dutton, is the work of Gosta af Geijerstam, and is translated from the Norwegian by John Birkehead. Sunlight, fields, children, sea, impudic northern air and an old family servant—these are the ingredients of this charming picture of life on a Norway fjord. There is unusual peace and beauty about this little story, which readers will find most soothing.

A Norwegian family spends the summer on an island which is enchanted, in the minds of not only the children, Pelle, Brit, Svante, Peter, Lorens and Golle but also in the minds of their parents. In simple style the author describes the haying, milking, visiting the gull's nest and telling stories in the evening about fairies and spirits. Painted in delicate pastel, this whole charming picture blends into the mysterious and beautiful setting of Norway.

Dutton also publishes "Japanese Lady in Europe," by Haruko Ichikawa. Madame Ichikawa is the granddaughter of the late Viscount Shibusewa, sometimes called "The Grand Old Man of Japan." She is a keenly observant traveler—whatever she describes seems important—whether it is cutting paper dolls for some small, restless Russians to beguile a tedious journey across a wilderness of snow in Siberia, or suffering through a merciless barrage of questions from Walter de la Mare, at the Bingos dinner in London. And if the acid test of a travel book is not its quotability, these shrewdly collected anecdotes will bear witness to its charm.
