It includes grading, seeding, sodding, the erection of rustic guard rails and the planting of trees, evergreens, shrubs, etc. and will probably be completed in about four months.

The last contract awarded to the company called for all the side and center planting on Woodward avenue between Birmingham and Bloomfield Center, and was let in 1936.
