### TROJANS BREAK RECORD IN SCORE AGAINST MAPLES

Monroe's test was too keen for Birmingham Friday when the Trojans broke all previous high score records by beating the Maples 33-18 before 1,500 spectators at Monroe. Lanky Bob Aldridge led the scoring with 13 points as the Trojans recorded their third victory of the season while Birmingham suffered her first defeat in three starts...

The Birmingham squad received its first set-back in the second team game. The game was very close with first one team and then the other on top. The reserve Maples team was leading the half by the slim margin of one point but dropped the final decision 24-22...

The second game was decidedly Monroe's with the Trojans showing superior strength throughout the tilt. Aldridge was high man and baffled the locals with four spectacular goals in the first half and two in the second...

The floor was regulation size, some 30 feet longer than the Baldwin gym. This kept the Birmingham boys working hard throughout the game. According to referee Cliff Crane, it was about the fastest game at which he has officiated this season...

For the third consecutive game, Lacey MacLean came through with three field goals. But the rest of the team handicapped as no other member made over two points. Bub "Gus" Peabody entered the game for the first time this season and sank a field goal for his first contribution to the Birmingham scoring column. He has been out for two weeks because of illness, but from all indications he will be in there from now on...

The Maple team continues its out-of-town game schedule which it plays Royal Oak on January 7, 1938.
