Here Are Some Suggestions That Your Children Will Enjoy

In one New York hotel a choice of 141 egg dishes is offered to patrons. How many can you offer your family? It is very important that children enjoy eggs because they are so valuable in building healthy little bodies; or try serving them in some of the most attractive ways and your family won't tire of them.

Eggs Benedict. Split and toast muffins. Sauté circular pieces of cold boiled ham. Place ham on the toasted muffin halves. Place a poached egg on top of each. Cover with hollandaise sauce. To make the sauce, melt 2 tablespoons of butter in top of double boiler over boiling water. Add 2 tablespoons of flour and stir to a smooth paste. Add 1 cup of milk gradually, stirring constantly. Add 1/2 teaspoon salt and a dash of pepper and cayenne. Slowly add the beaten yolk of 1 egg mixed with a little of the sauce. Continue stirring and add 2 tablespoons of lemon juice. Remove from the fire and slowly add 1/2 cup of mayonnaise. Blend well.

The old-fashioned home-made ice cream made with a hand freezer is still the most wholesome kind of ice cream, particularly for growing children and for women too, who find the many modern varieties of frozen desserts too rich and fattening.

Here is the recipe that Mother used to follow when she made a gallon of ice cream:

Japanese Platter
 1 cup cooked rice
 2 tablespoons melted butter
 1 teaspoon salt
 1/2 cup cooked peas
 1/2 cup diced cheese
 1 egg
 4 stuffed olives

Parley
 Mix together the rice, melted butter, salt, peas and cheese. Spread on a greased oven-proof glass platter and top with a casserole. Make 4 small wells in the mixture, brook an egg in each. Bake in an oven 375 degrees until the eggs are set and the cheese is melted. This takes about 20 minutes. Garnish with olives, sliced, and parsley.

Raswan To Lecture On Arabia Sunday At Arts Institute

"Black Tents of Arabia" is the arresting subject—the lecture will be illustrated with magnificent pictures—of Carl B. Raswan at the World Adventure Series platform at the Detroit Institute of Arts at 2 P. M. on Sunday afternoon, January 24. Carl Raswan, international orator and author, has traveled for 25 years with his caravan.

As a youth Carl Raswan went to Egypt, became interested in Arabian horses. By a strange accident he was adopted into the unwinding Raswan tribe as blood brother to the Sheik. Three months afterwards owned 7,000 black hair tents, 1,200 war horses, and 250,000 camels. They wandered over an area a third the size of the United States, tending and fighting. Raswan realized and fought as their companion. He was a fast friend of the famous Lawrence of Arabia. He was a member of the widely praised book "Black Tents of Arabia."

REALISM FOR CHILDREN
 All fiction written for children or grownups necessarily falls into one of two classes: the "romantic" or "realistic." Little folk stories of the latter type, as soon as they are old enough to understand and enjoy any story, "dick" the little kid's "realistic" (or "dick") are examples of them. The modern trend in juvenile literature is to introduce the young reader to literature in which stories much earlier than was formerly thought advisable. By realistic stories is meant writings which include happenings of every day with an eye on the playground and anything which a child might recognize as experiences of his own life. If the child can recognize the neighbor's dog, the old model "T" or the Jones' pet dog or even Mr. Brown, who never allows any boys or girls to step on his lawn, he is going to be delighted.

The old-fashioned juvenile books tell us much about the attitude toward children, of the schools, and the real discipline but nothing of the child himself. Poetry will never look back upon the books written today with the same amusement that we perceive "Louis" or the Beauty of Irigay." "Stops for Young" or "The Two Cousins" a Moral Story for the Use of Young Persons, for the Author of the Blind Child and Dramatic Dialogues.

Dr. Walter Scott once said, "I will make it my business to take a child will understand, yet a man will feel some temptation to persuade the child to do things that are not up to him." "Tales of a Grandfather" written for children is equally enjoyed by adults. So don't feel embarrassed if someone catches you reading and enjoying one of Little White's story books. It probably is an exceptionally good juvenile.

When can you find a person who doesn't enjoy reading aloud nonsense rhymes and stories such as "Curl" and "Land's" "Owl and Stars" or "Saw" the "Two and Wednesday" book each week. (—AD—)
