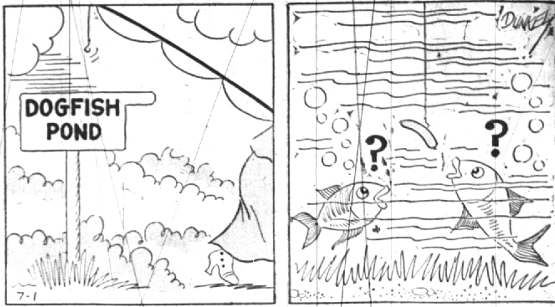
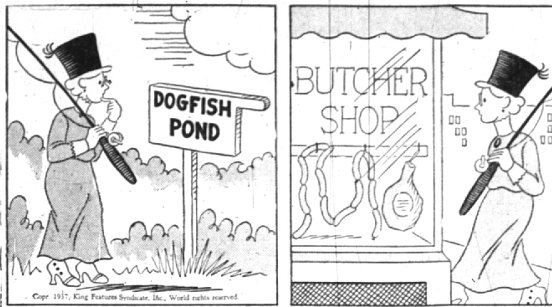

**WORKERS' INCOME SHARE INCREASES**

Statistics Show Employee's 1936 Record Is 66 1/2% of Total

Good news for the workman is contained in a recent report of the Department of Commerce giving figures on the 1936 national income. For it shows that the labor share of the national income last year was the highest on record.

Total national income reached \$92,056,000,000 when 66.5 per cent, or \$41,250,000,000 went to workers. Per capita income of employees last year increased 5.8 per cent to a total of \$1,244. Total compensation to employees in 1936 was 14 per cent greater than in 1935. The entire national income was up \$7,411,000,000 over the previous year.

Among individual producers of income last year, the largest was manufacturing, which provided \$14,253,000,000. The government was next with \$9,241,000,000, inclusive of work relief wages.

The figures were for income paid, meaning wages, dividends, interest, royalties, rent and similar costs. Income produced, however, net value of all commodities produced and services rendered totaled \$85,270,000,000 in 1936 or \$1,143,000,000 more than income paid. This excess was classified by the Department of Commerce as "business savings." There were no such savings in 1935 and 1934.

Late Book Reviews and Literary Criticism

**"Reading Habits of the Boss"**

Professor Paul T. Cheerington, at a recent convention of insurance gave authoritative information on the reading habits of high class executives of the \$20,000 a year class. He maintains and has statistics to prove it that very few men of that class ever read a worthwhile book. One very good reason for the time cost. This same statistic has figured out that it costs a \$20,000 a year boss \$500 to read an ordinary sized book. No one denies the fact that they read books, which pertain to their particular field or industry, but spend very little time reading that which will aid them in human understanding.

Malcolm Binzay, in an interesting article on this very problem. He points out that the factory worker with his 30 hour week will have so much time to read and think that in time he will be much better equipped to run the business world than the "fellows who are now making 75c an hour."

To thoroughly enjoy a book it is nice to live with it for a few days after completion; nice to analyze the characters; to attempt to re-produce what they did or that and try to assume the author's viewpoint and figure out just what he had in mind when he wrote the book.
