### Birmingham before today

 The 80 acre farm at the southeast corner of Southfield and Lincoln avenues belonged to C. Swan. There were two daughters in the Swan family and one son. The daughters were Elizabeth and Esther. Elizabeth was Mrs. Elizabeth Kemp, mother of other of the Swans. Esther never married. The son was the father of the Swans. The Swans were a family of two years ago. Elizabeth is buried in Greenwood cemetery.

The next owner of the Swan farm was Mr. Richard Erwin, husband of Flora Bassett Erwin and father of Lewis and Mae Belle Erwin. Lewis is the husband of the former Miss Juanita Plumstead. They and their family live in the former "Dick" Erwin home.  
 The old Swan house was sold to Mr. Ed Daniels. He moved to a lot on the north side of the old Daniels brick yard, and it was used for a tent and storage. It was moved to the west side of the Daniels home, at the rear of the yard and used by Mr. Daniels for a shop. A large sign over the door gives Mr. Daniels' name and occupation. For many years Mr. Daniels has been a driller of wells. His wife was the former Miss Catherine Helen. They have one daughter, Helen, and two grandchildren. Helen and her husband and children make their home with Mr. and Mrs. Daniels in the old Daniels home, on the southwest corner of Pierce street and Lincoln avenue.

After the Swan house was moved to the Daniels property, Mr. Erwin erected a modern house on the site of the old home house and his wife both pass away while residents of this house. Mr. and Mrs. Richard Erwin were active members of the First Presbyterian Church and were much beloved by the young people of the church and town. The Erwin farm was finally divided and has become a residential section.  
 The Daniels farm, which is now crossed by Bates street, south of Lincoln avenue, had a race track at this point. The house on the south west corner of Lincoln and Bates was built for Mr. and Mrs. Guy Watkins. I believe Mrs. Watkins' name was Sibly before her marriage. Her parents were Birmingham residents for a few years.

The Daniels farm joined the Jack Keyser farm at the south and there was a wood lot at this point. The young folks of the town used to go flowering here in the spring. There was a swale in this woods and the children used to enjoy walking on the "wood timber" in the swale. The Keyser woods was south and east of the Daniels wood lot. It was full of a variety of wild flowers. It had a large number of black raspberry bushes. This was quite a den of woods in many places and it was quite easy for one to lose his bearings when roaming through it. This is now a part of "Eco City."  
 My husband and daughter, Grace, and I lived on the old Stay place from 1903 to 1909. Our son, Charles, was born here in 1908. At the time of our residence here, 15 acres of it was owned by Mr. and Mrs. Aaron B. Seltzer, of Detroit. They were the parents of Henry P. and Edith Mae Seltzer, and were residents of this farm in 1896, '97, '98 and a portion of '99, when they returned to their home in Detroit. When we lived on this farm we often drove to town in the evening and often passed through a very foggy section just opposite to the old brick yard. I often remarked about the fog in this part and wondered what would ever be built in this section. It has now been drained and part of it is the site of the Pierce school. Mr. and Mrs. Robert Moore and sons, Herbert and Young, lived on the Keyser farm for a few years. They were wonderful neighbors. The sons attended Hill school.

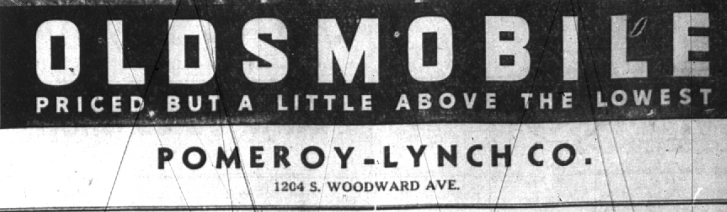
