

NAVY TO GET TWO IN 77TH DISTRICT

Annapolis Exam Is Set For Nov. 6; Requirements Are Listed

Rep. George A. Dundero announced this week that the United States Civil Service Commission will conduct a competitive examination for candidates for the United States Naval Academy at Annapolis, on Saturday, November 6. District principals and alternates will be determined at this time. In the 17th Michigan district, comprising all of Oakland county, the 22nd Ward of the city of Detroit and Livonia, Northville, Plymouth and Redford townships in Wayne county, Rep. Dundero has two vacancies to be filled for the class entering the Academy in 1938.

Candidates must have reached their 16th birthday by April 1 and not have attained their 20th birthday by March 31 of the year of entering Annapolis. Their legal residence must be within the district of the representative who is sponsoring them to whom they may write for additional information, including a booklet outlining the full scope of the examination. Subjects in which they will be tested include algebra, plane geometry, English composition and literature. United States history, ancient history and physics.

Grim Picture for Rebel Captors of Bilbao

Laid waste by heavy gunfire and aerial bombing as Loyalist and Rebel forces continued a bloody struggle begun more than a year ago, Spain presents a grim picture. Latest target to fall was Bilbao, ancient capital of the Basque republic. Above, two dramatic photos portray Bilbao's surrender to the Rebels. At the left, a shambles, is a church on the outskirts of Bilbao as it appeared after days of concentrated fire from General Franco's artillery in the Rebels' final assault on the conquered metropolis. The right, a column of Franco's troops is shown marching victoriously into the conquered metropolis. Immediately upon entering Bilbao, the Rebels fed the populace, reentered order and proceeded to consolidate the position against counter-attack.
