

## N. R. S. FINDS STATE JOBS FOR YOUTHS

Director Starrett Reports  
Third of Work Goes  
To 16-25 Group

Approximately one-third of the men and women placed on jobs through the National Reemployment Service in Michigan are youths between the ages of 16 and 25. It was revealed today by Major Howard Starrett, State Reemployment Director. The analysis of youth placements, issued in Washington, covered the period from November, 1936 through March, 1937.

The forty-four district and branch offices throughout Michigan placed 16,294 youths on jobs during this period. Major Starrett said. At the same time 47,630 men and women over 25 years of age received employment.

Michigan youth has been unusually fortunate in receiving over 32 per cent of the openings available in this state. According to recent printed reports, youths in many out state sections have received less than ten per cent of the jobs available to persons in all age groups.

"In many states the placements of girls far exceeds the men," Major Starrett said. "However, in Michigan, 9,725 of the 15,294 youths placed during the period covered by the report were men and only 5,569 were women."

The National Reemployment Service operates 44 district and branch offices as well as 86 itinerant or part time offices in every section of Michigan. All unemployed are permitted to register without cost.

## The BOOK SHELF



Late Book Reviews and  
Literary Criticism

One critic calls attention to the fact that contemporary authors of thrillers seem to feel that it is necessary to include a love interest and to get some one married or well on the way to it before the reader reaches the last page. He also reminds us that there is no "mush" in such successful adventure stories as "Treasure Island" or "The Thirty-nine Steps."

There have been to date more than forty-five books issued in connection with the recent eruption. On the whole, we are told, that

they do not add very much to our knowledge of the ceremony. The one way in which they are superior to previous material on the subject is in the quality of the photographs included. Even the less ambitious handbooks have outstanding photographs in them. In the opinion of "The London Times" the best work is "A History of the English Coronation" by Dr. P. E. Schramm, professor of Medieval History at Göttingen.

Most successful authors are those who have dealt exclusively with one publishing company so says a staff contributor to "The Bookman" and he deprecates the growing tendency among the younger writers to change publishers without hesitation. He admits an apparent exception in the case of H. G. Wells who has always sold on the open market. But who knows but that even he might be "more popular" if he had the backing of one particularly good publishing house.

To honor the centenary of William Dean Howells' birth, Houghton Mifflin have made a reprint of "The Blue Bird" by L. Frank Baum where in his writings does he show more clearly, his keen insight and sympathetic understanding of the American scene.

He was a realist who depended upon incidents to portray the spiritual qualities of his characters. He believed that characters in fiction should first of all be true and it is largely through his influence that many of the foreign masterpieces—Russian, Italian, and Spanish, were understood and appreciated in this country. He was also, one keen interpreter of the social life of the latter part of the last century and in years to come it will be the work that we shall turn for authentic records of American culture.

Born in Martin's Ferry, Ohio, he was scarcely nine years old when he started working in his father's country newspaper office. He never went to college nor even to high school yet he became, through his extensive reading and travel, one of America's most cultured men. During his lifetime he received honors from many colleges including Oxford. He became a journalist of note and from 1900 to the time of his death in 1920 he wrote "The Easy Chair" in Harpers Magazine, a column now written by Bernard DeVoto.

William Dean Howells wrote many books besides novels; travel records, plays, excellent poetry and keen literary criticism. He has exerted considerable influence over America's choice of reading matter. In 1900 he wrote a biography of Lincoln which so pleased the president that he appointed Howells as United States consul to Venice.

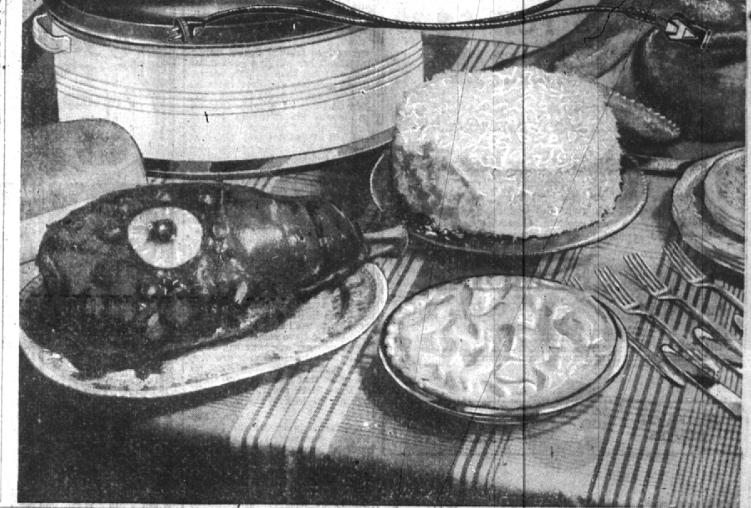

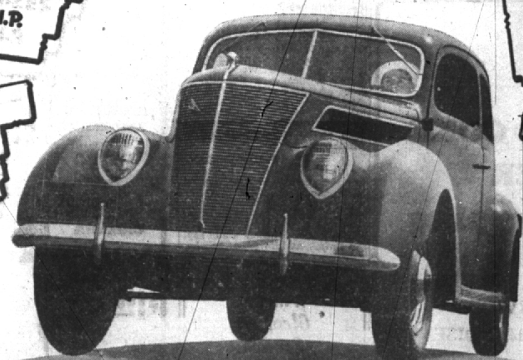
