TALKS ON HEALTH

SIXTY ATTEND TB LECTURE MONDAY

Supt. of Oakland County Sanatorium Speaks At House

Dr. G. A. Sherman, superintendent of the Oakland County Sanatorium, spoke to an audience of approximately sixty persons on the diagnosis and prevention of tuberculosis at the Community House Monday evening.

The program for the evening, under the direction of Mrs. H. H. Corson, opened with a talking picture on the prevention of tuberculosis, presented by Mr. Theodore J. Werle, executive director of the Michigan Tuberculosis Association.

Dr. Sherman, introduced to the audience dealing with the subject of tuberculosis, explained in detail that tuberculosis is not inherited, but acquired only through direct exposure.

Dr. Sherman stressed the fact that a person who is likely to pass the germs along, or in other words, expose others, should be confined to a sanitarium. Check-up every three months during a two-year period for persons exposed to the disease is a necessity, he went on to say.

Dr. Sherman outlined the use of the x-ray in determining the extent or source of the germ in a person, and the most effective method of outlining the lung to kill the germs contained therein. Throughout his lecture, Dr. Sherman illustrated his points with his stereoscopic slides of actual cases.

Dr. Sherman advised those present that tuberculosis was the greatest cause of death today, and that the disease was spreading rapidly among children of high school age.

In answer to questions from members of the audience it was explained by the doctor that anyone in Michigan is entitled to sanitarium care if necessary.

Dr. William H. Kelly, assistant physician of the Pontiac State Hospital, will give the concluding lecture of the series Monday evening at the Community House on "Mental Hygiene."

CAPACITY LAW IS PASSED BY CITY COUNCIL

New Ordinance Licenses and Regulates Amusements, Entertainments

After consideration at several previous meetings, a carnival ordinance, licensing and regulating amusements and entertainments in this community and providing for violations, was passed last night by the city commission at their Monday evening session in the Municipal Building.

A five dollar initial fee, coupled with an assessment of one dollar for each day for which the license is issued, to be paid to the city clerk, it stipulated in the new ordinance.

It also requires that the licensee show a certificate of insurance provided by a liability insurance protection in an amount of not less than \$10,000 for any one person and not less than \$20,000 for any one accident.

The ordinance bans all amusements to be made in machine city clerk not less than 30 days prior to the opening of the amusement or entertainment.

All games must be approved by the police department before being placed in operation, and prizes offered in connection with games must be in the form of merchandise. No money may be offered in place of such prizes.

Indecent and immoral shows are banned. Penalties for violation of the ordinance will be a fine of not more than \$100 and costs or imprisonment of not more than 90 days.

Pass Gambling Ordinance An ordinance licensing and regulating amusement and amusements devices and to prohibit the use of such devices for gambling purposes in the city was also passed by the city commission.

The ordinance bans all mechanical devices which contain automatic pay-offs, an amusements device operated in the city will require the payment of a \$50 license fee.
