## Saturday Club Closes The Season With Open Program and Exhibit

Completing a term of ten weeks, the Saturday Club, a playtime project sponsored by the Birmingham branch of the American Association of University Women, closed its third season Saturday with a program and exhibit at the Community House.

The purpose of the club is to provide an opportunity for recreation and craftwork to Birmingham children between the ages of eight and ten years. The average attendance, club records show for the term, has been 82 children a week.

Parents and friends were invited to attend classes on the closing day, and watch the children engaged in the various occupations

taught them by volunteer members of the A. A. U. W. Among the classes meeting were those in woodwork and metal work, art, clay modeling, sewing knitting and paperwork.

At 2 p. m., instructors, children and guests assembled in the auditorium for a brief closing program. Mrs. William H. Bushman, a member of the club committee for the A. A. U. W., opened the program with brief address, introducing Superintendent

of Schools, Howard D. Crull. Mr. Crull commended the club for the opportunity it offered children to do things in which they are interested with "very little restriction."

"The Saturday Club is a democratic enterprise," Mr. Crull said, "where children meet on common ground to work together for a common cause. We of the public schools do not regard the club as a challenge, but value its assistance in helping children to develop their latent ability in various lines. If more thought could be given to the use of free time, other opportunities could be provided for avocational training. My hope for the club is that it will grow until everyone in the community will be interested."

The program opened with an old English folk dance, "Buffy Tufty," by four members of the class directed by Mrs. Fred D.

## CRANBROOK PLANS MUSIC FESTIVAL

The concert will be presented under the direction of Miss Helen Shoup of Kingswood, assisted by Mr. Curtis and Albert J. Fillmore of Cranbrook School.
