Town Hall Season Closes Wednesday With 'Opera Russe'

Outstanding Loans To Farmers \$713,700

Oakland county farmers have outstanding \$713,700 in loans on their farms as the result of operations of the Farmers' Loan and Bank of St. Paul 20 years ago, March 17. The bank's charter was granted March 17, 1917, following many years of study of country life and rural credit problems in this country and Europe. The farm loan act creating the land banks was approved on July 17, 1916.

The basis for the volume of loans is chiefly the national farm loan associations, through which land bank loans are made. However, in order to meet the emergency of 1912 congress that provided for "compensation" loans by which additional credit may be extended to farmers. The land bank act as agent of the committee on the part of the land banks, the local association assisting.

NON-PARTISAN STATE NEWS LETTER

LANSING—The ides of March this week find the Michigan state legislature, much of the electorate, and thousands of industrial workers all on a "sit-down" strike. Spring is scheduled to begin Saturday (March 20) but spring fever has already arrived.

The legislature is still in law gear. Leaders had been hopeful that Governor Murphy's return from Florida—concedent amount with President Roosevelt's departure for the South—might open the gates for the civil service bill (Murphy's No. 1) in the legislature. However, the industrial "sit-down" strikes in Detroit and elsewhere put an end to the dreaming.

Voters "Sit Down" Too
Approach of the April elections this week found both parties—democratic and republican—hurrying candidates on speaking tours and pushing plans for an aggressive "get-out-the-vote" campaign. However, in law and politics there exists in the public mind at present, and it has demonstrated in the Republican state central committee, was reported to be very closed with prospects.

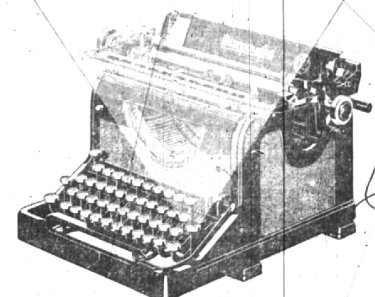
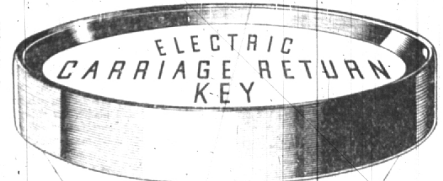

Cherry Crop
A favorable start was made when the cherry crop in Michigan one of the largest in production, the horticulturists. There was no large emergency of control goods for the coming year, and with food prices already spiraling, the outlook is encouraging.

Price Fixing
Fixed commodity prices through contract agreement between wholesalers and retailers would be legalized in Michigan, if a bill introduced by the Michigan State Supreme Court of Port Huron becomes a law. The measure was reported favorably by the house state affairs committee.

Designed after a fair trade law now effective in California and held constitutional by the United States supreme court, the Michigan bill would destroy much of existing competition between retailers in the sale of any article which bears the name or brand of the producer.
