

BALLET OFFERS NEW PROGRAM

Jooss Troupe To Appear In Unique Repertory At Orchestra Hall

The season's first big ballet event will take place Saturday night, Nov. 20, at 8:30 o'clock in Orchestra Hall, at which time the Jooss European Ballet, internationally famous dance troupe, will be presented in a single performance under auspices of the Detroit Symphony Society.
