

STATE TO ADVISE LATE APPLICANTS

Plan To Inform Tardy Ones Why License Can't Be Returned on Time

Two changes in procedure of issuing operators' and chauffeurs' licenses have been ordered by Leon D. Case, Secretary of State.

In cases where applications for operators' licenses are received in Lansing from local examining officers too late to permit return of the license within the 20 day temporary permit period provided by law, postcards advising applicants of this fact, will be sent to them.

The date any such application was received at the Department of State will be noted on the card.

This move is one to forestall queries from applicants as to their applications after the 20 day period has expired.

Chauffeurs' licenses and badges for 1938 will be placed on sale Dec. 1, saving applicants applying that month, the \$1 fee for a 1937 license and badge for the remainder of the year.

The full year fee is \$2. There are in excess of 4,000 more chauffeurs registered at present than at the corresponding time last year, it was explained.

The Dec. 1 deadline will eliminate delays; badges must be secured by Jan 1, each year. Previously, badges and licenses were placed on sale Dec. 15, or later.
