WOMEN

Whenever a man takes it upon himself to generalize in sweeping statements about the sacrifices of motherhood, we who know what it's all about, put tongue in cheek, and smile indulgently. We might even say to ourselves, "Just Like A Man!"

And so, with due respect, we were amused at the remarks of the Rev. W. Hamilton Hamilton, Chester, Chatham, Cranbrook, denouncing the folly of maternal sacrifice, in an address before a tri-club gathering (all men, by the way) at the Community House, recently.

His title, "Living As You Live," was based on the theme, "Make the most of the present, and the future will take care of itself. Elaborating on this idea, Mr. Aulenbach stated in part:
"Mothers who sacrifice for their children, doing without the clothes which will keep them smart looking and the books and lectures which will keep their up-to-date, may want to be martyrs, but their children will, when they graduate from college (graduation being made possible by the sacrifices of their mothers) be ashamed of them at these very graduations."

We might observe, in passing, it was fortunate the speaker was addressing an audience of men. Women usually have their own ideas on this subject—based on experience.

But considering the remarks from an impersonal and unemotional viewpoint, it is a fair conclusion to draw that a mother should indulge herself even at the cost of a college education for her child, to the end that he may not be ashamed of his mother?

That's a little hard to follow and a little hard to "swallow." Pursuing this line of reasoning, it would seem, the aim of motherhood is not so much that of giving her child equal opportunity with his contemporaries, as to float before his eyes the paragon of all that is "smart" and "up-to-date"—and sacrifice be damned!

Granted, a woman should keep herself "smart" and "up-to-date," if she fails to, it is more likely due to mental or physical laziness than to the spirit of sacrifice. One can be mentally progressive and appear well-groomed on a meager budget, if she has the desire and energy to do so.

But suppose, while on the subject, a mother should follow his advice and go in for self-adorment and self-improvement in a large way. Suppose she gave as her excuse the fear that her child might be "left behind" by graduation from college?

It may not have occurred to Mr. Aulenbach that the son or daughter of such a mother might reflect with justifiable bitterness upon her extravagance which proved an obstacle in the economic path to college education.

But such a case would be the exception to the rule. Because mothers do make sacrifices for their children! They deny themselves, not because, as Mr. Aulenbach stated, they "want to be martyrs," but for another reason.

Nineteen-hundred-and-thirty-seven years ago, the Greatest Teacher of All Time gave mankind that reason. He taught that the real motive behind sacrifice is love. Without love, there can be no sacrifice. One follows as a natural result of the other. Sacrifice is spontaneous as an expression of love. It comes without thought of self-interest or expediency.
