Betrothal Revealed By Parents Of Bride-Elect

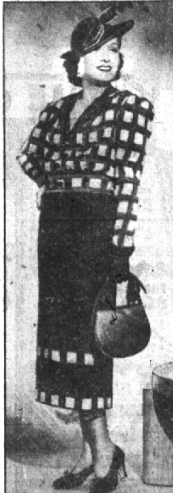

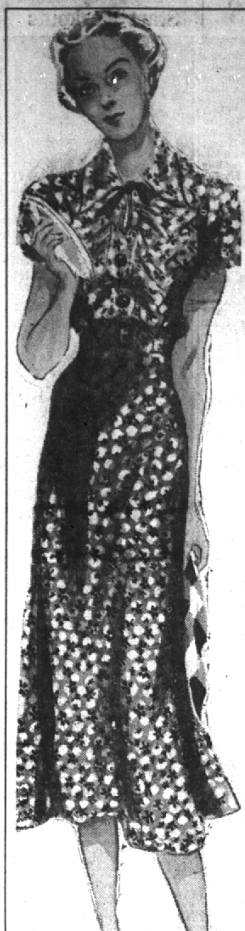
Fashion Tips
