

SINK ANNOUNCES SEASON RECITALS

Ann Arbor Musical Schedule Is Outstanding For Year

Dr. Charles A. Sink, President of the School of Music of the University of Michigan, has just announced the detailed schedule of recitals to be given in Ann Arbor during the coming season.

In the Fifty-Ninth Annual Choral Union Series, ten concerts will be heard, as follows:

 November 2—The Cleveland Orchestra, Arthur Rodin, Conductor.
 November 15—Richard Crooks, Tenor.
 November 29—Fritz Kreisler, Violinist.
 December 2—Boston Symphony Orchestra, Serge Koussevitzky, Conductor.
 January 16—Ruth Sienzynski, Pianist.
 January 18—Finish Chorus from the University of Helsinki, Martti Turunen, Conductor.
 January 28—Gina Cigna, Soprano.
 February 17—Roth String Quartet from Budapest, Feri Roth, Founder and First Violin, Jeno Antal, Second Violin, Ferenc Molnar, Viola, Janos Scholz, Violoncello.

March 1—Georges Enesco, Violinist.
 Dr. Sink also stated that contracts have been executed with the Philadelphia Orchestra Association whereby the Philadelphia Orchestra will, for the third consecutive year, participate in the six concerts of the 1938 May Festival, which will take place on Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday, May 11, 12, 13, and 14. Eugene Ormandy will conduct. In accordance with well established precedent, comprehensive series of organ recitals and carillon recitals will be given.

In the Twilight Organ Recital Series, Palmer Christian will give the first program on Wednesday afternoon, October 6, at 4:15 o'clock. The second program will take place Wednesday evening, October 13 at 8:00 o'clock, on which occasion the distinguished French organist, Marcel Dupre, will be the soloist. On account of the large attendance anticipated, and in order that the Auditorium may not be overcrowded, admission will be by ticket. Tickets may be procured free of charge by calling or communicating with the office of the University School of Music. Other distribution points will be announced later.

Wilmot F. Pratt will continue recitals on the Baird carillon, consisting of short daily periods of playing during the noon hour, and regular recitals at other stated intervals.

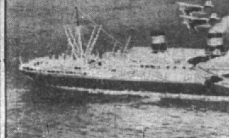

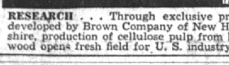

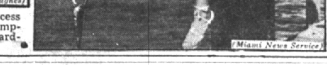
